

The Lie Machine

Engage in a hot seating activity. Three students can be selected to be in the hot seat, taking on the roles of Billy, Gus and Mr Higgins. The rest of the class work in small groups to develop a series of questions for the three characters to respond to.

Sample questions include:

- Mr. Higgins, what did you think was happening when Billy rushed in to find you in the classroom?
- Gus, do you regret making your invention?
- Billy, what was it like having a 'lie' embedded into your brain?

Write a reflection on your experiences, after the hot seating activity. Include the following:

- The lesson that can be learnt from reading this story
- How the hot seating activity helped you to understand the issues around lying.
- Reflect on what you liked about the story and how it made you feel when you read it.
- You might also like to imagine what 'lie' you might have put into Billy's brain if you were Gus.

	c) He wished he had of invented a time machine instead.
